Instruction manual

Thank you for choosing Bassface. We pride ourselves on making quality products and with our R&D team we are always working on refinements to ensure the customer gets the best quality products.

At the foot of this manual there is a section containing important safety instructions. Please ensure this is read/understood/followed.

A strong healthy battery is key to a quality audio system. We always recommend that your battery be charged outside of the vehicle to avoid interfering with the any electrical systems. Vehicle battery must be removed in accordance with manufacturer guidelines. It should be placed in a well-vented area of your garage or workspace away from any flammable or liquid products. If the removal of the battery is deemed to be problematic (lost codes, reboot issues etc) then you should seek approval from the vehicle manufacturer to confirm that on car charging is safe and will not cause electrical issues.



Controls and functions



Upon connection of a battery in workable order the Bassface charger will automatically detect the voltage of the battery and default to a 2 Amp charge rate.

For AGM batteries, batteries in a “completely flat” state or for charging in temperatures below zero degrees press and hold “AMPS” for 2-3 seconds and the light will illuminate.

If a battery fault is detected, the “Battery Fault” indicator will start to flash. To cycle between different charge rates, press the “AMPS” button. The corresponding light to the selected rate of amps will illuminate.

As your battery is charging, the charging indicators will start to light up to represent progressive charging. Indicator lights are as follows, and refer to the approximate level of charge within the battery:



Operating Instructions – Please read carefully

Connect the terminal rings/clamps directly to the corresponding connectors on the battery posts. Note: Make sure correct polarity connection before plugging in the AC power.

Position the RED terminal on the POSITIVE post connector

Position the BLACK terminal on the NEGATIVE post connector

Connect the AC power cord with the AC power outlet. The Power LED indicator quickly flashes on and then off

The charger will automatically select the right voltage according to the battery voltage type and the corresponding LED indicator will turn on.

For AGM batteries or batteries which are stored in sub-zero conditions please connect the charger to the battery as explained above. Press and hold the AMPS buttons to 2-3 seconds. You will notice that the AGM, Sub-zero indicator light will illuminate. Please do not use this function on normal lead acid batteries, which are neither AGM or stored in sub-zero conditions. To exit this function, simply reverse the procedure.

Once your battery is fully charged as per the charging indicator level disconnect the AC power cord from the AC power outlet. Then disconnect the connection with the battery. Please Note: ALWAYS disconnect the AC power cord from the AC power outlet before connecting (or disconnecting) the charger to (or from) the battery.

Diagnosis & Recovery

Automatic diagnosis of battery condition begins the moment the charger is connected and set to charge. The logic is as follows:

For deeply discharged 12V batteries where voltage is over $4.5V \pm 0.5V$, the charger automatically begins charging with 1.5A low current to recover it, which terminates when voltage reaches to $10.5V \pm 0.25V$.

For deeply discharged 24v batteries where voltage is over $16V \pm 0.25V$, the charger automatically begins charging with 1.5A low current to recover it, which terminates when voltage reaches $21V \pm 0.25V$.

When the charger detects a voltage $>10.5V$ (for 12V battery) or $21V$ (for 24V battery) the unit will begin to charge normally at a 2A slow charge rate. Should you need to speed the charge rate up this should be done manually by pressing the “AMPS” button.

For a 12V battery 2A slow charge, 5A medium charge and 10A fast charge rate is selectable.

For a 24V battery 2A slow charge or 5A medium charge rate is selectable.

Absorption

Use of a constant high current for extended periods of time risks gassing the battery, therefore a constant low charging current is given at 1.5A to raise voltage from 28.2V to 28.8V (for 24V battery) and 14.1V to 14.4V (for 12V battery). In this phase complete charging up to almost 100% is achieved. Charger switches to trickle charge phase after sensing that the battery is truly fully charged.

Maintenance Charge

The charger continuously monitors the terminal voltage in order to determine if maintenance charging should be initiated. If the battery has a load applied to it and/or terminal voltage falls below 25.6V (for 24V battery) or 12.8V (for 12V battery), the charger starts its maintenance charging pulse at a constant 1.5A until voltage reaches to 28.8V (for 24V battery) or 14.4V (for 12V battery). At this point maintenance charging is disengaged. The cycle of trickle charging and maintenance charging is repeated indefinitely to keep the battery in good condition when it is not in use, and enables the charger to be left connected indefinitely.

Trouble Shooting



Once connected, if this light illuminates RED, it means you have reverse polarity hook up. Please check and ensure that your leads are connected correctly to the battery.

If any of these symbols are flashing it means that your battery is faulty and will not accept a charge. Please dispose of your battery in a safe environmentally friendly way. Please check with your local environmental office.

Power source

The Bassface charger has a unique power supply mode. This especially comes handy when changing batteries on your vehicle to retain 12v to the cars computer system. To active the function on you would need to connect the charger to the mains, without a battery connected press and hold the Amps button for 3~5 seconds. When this mode is activated, the charger Maximum output will be 13.6V/ 5A. In this mode, you can use the charger as a Power Supply to provide constant power to 12V DC appliances with 5A(max) output current. To exit, press Amps button once

Important Safety Instruction

This battery charger is for the use of charging/boosting a lead -acid battery only. Do not use this charger on a home appliance or/on dry cell batteries as they can burst causing injury to persons and/or property.

Do not operate unit with damaged cord or plug or if the unit has received a sharp blow, been dropped, or otherwise impaired in any way. Do not disassemble the unit as there are no user serviceable parts.

Never submerge this unit in water. Do not expose it to moisture. Do not use if the unit has got wet.

To reduce risk of electric shock, disconnect the unit from any power source before attempting maintenance or cleaning.

Working in the vicinity of a lead acid battery requires caution. Batteries generate explosive gases during normal battery operation. For this reason, it is important that each time before using the charger you read this manual and follow instructions exactly.

To reduce the risk of battery explosion, follow these instructions and those published by the battery manufacturer and manufacturer of any equipment you intend to use in the vicinity of the battery.

This equipment employs parts that produce arcs or sparks. Therefore, if used in a garage or enclosed area, the unit must be placed not less than 18 inches above the floor.

This unit is should only be operated by a qualified adult.

Pull cord by plug rather than cord when disconnecting the unit from the power source.

Never attempt to jump start or charge a frozen battery.

When working with lead acid batteries, always make sure immediate assistance is available in case of accident or emergency.

Always wear protective eyewear when using this product. Contact with battery acid may cause blindness and/or severe burns. Be aware of first aid procedures in case of accidental contact with battery acid.

Have plenty of fresh water and soap nearby in case battery acid contacts skin. If battery acid contacts skin or clothing, wash immediately with soap and water for at least 10 minutes and get medical attention immediately.

Never smoke or allow a spark or flame in vicinity of vehicle battery, engine or battery charger.

Remove personal metal items such as rings, bracelets, necklaces and watches when working with a lead acid battery.

A lead acid battery can produce a short circuit current high enough to weld a ring, or other metal object, causing a severe burn.

Never allow battery acid to come in contact with this unit.

Do not operate this unit in a closed area or restrict ventilation in any way.

If battery acid comes into contact with skin, rinse immediately with water, and then wash thoroughly with soap and water. If redness, pain, or irritation occurs, seek immediate medical attention.

If battery acid comes into contact with eyes, flush eyes immediately, for a minimum of 15 minutes and seek immediate medical attention.
